GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Temporary Workhouse: Regulations:—

Wolverhampton Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wolverhampton Union;

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General Orders bearing date respectively the 24th day of July, 1847, the 12th day of February, 1879, the 3rd day of November, 1892, and the 8th day of March, 1894 addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Wolverhampton Union (among others), the Poor Law Commissioners and the Local Government Board prescribed Rules and Regulations relating to the government and guidance of the said Guardians, the Government of the Workhouse of the said Union, the appointment by the said Guardians of Officers and Assistants at the said Workhouse, and the duties, remuneration, and continuance in office of such Officers and Assistants;

And whereas by a General Order dated the

And whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union (among others), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations for the keeping, examining, auditing, and

allowing of the Accounts of the said Guardians and their Officers, including the Accounts relating to the said Workhouse;

And whereas the said Guardians propose, with Our approval, to hire certain premises situate in Bilston-road, Wolverhampton, to be used as a temporary Workhouse for the said Union;

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The several Orders above mentioned shall, so far as they are applicable to the said temporary Workhouse, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, apply to such Workhouse accordingly.

ARTICLE II.—Articles 172 and 188 of the said Order of the 24th day of July, 1847, and Article 1 of the said Order of the 12th day of February, 1879, relating to the remuneration and the continuance in office of Officers or Assistants, are hereby suspended with respect to the said temporary Workhouse.

ARTICLE III.—Every Officer or Assistant at the said temporary Workhouse shall be appointed for such term and at such salary or remuneration as the said Guardians may determine; but the particulars of every such appointment, including the name of the Officer or Asistant, the term for
