APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of an Act passed in the 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the consolidated Offices."

I, EDWARD RIDLEY COLBORNE BRADFORD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint Standings for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned, for such number of carriages at each standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each standing, provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

BROADWAY,	Stratford.	Four Carriages. On the West side of St. John's Church, Stratford, to stand abreast in front of, and backing on to, the urinal, with horses' heads Westward.
THE GROVE,	Stratford.	Six Carriages. At the East of St. John's Church, The Grove, Stratford. To stand on the West side of road, close to the kerb, with horses' heads toward the north.
FOREST LANE,	Stratford.	Four Carriages. On the North side of road by waste ground at the corner of Forest Lane and Leytonstone Road. Horses' heads eastward.
