NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to the provisions of the Railways Clauses Act 1863, and the Railway and Canal Traffic Acts 1873 and 1888, and the Waterford and Limerick Railway (Arrangements) Act 1866 that the Great Western Railway Company and the Waterford and Limerick Railway Company have entered into an agreement for the following purposes, viz.
