(PORT OF PLYMOUTH (SUTTON POOL)—LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of and define the following part of the Port of Plymouth as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space in the Harbour of Sutton Pool, Plymouth, being the southern portion of the Timber Jetty known as Sutton Jetty, and projecting into such Harbour from the southern end of Sutton Wharf and at right angles to the wharf known as Vauxhall Quay, included within a boundary line commencing at a point at the water edge of the Jetty on its eastern side one hundred and thirty-five feet or thereabouts from the point where the Jetty adjoins the said Vauxhall Quay and Sutton Wharf, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern face of the Jetty to the end of such Jetty being a distance of thirty-six feet or thereabouts, then along the end or southern face of the Jetty westwards for a distance of thirty-four feet six inches or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction parallel with the western face of the Jetty for a distance of twenty-seven feet and six inches or thereabouts, thence in an easterly direction twenty-
