Dalrymple Lord Archbishop of York the Ordinary of the said rectory of the third part and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fourth part (which indenture is intended to be enrolled in Your Majesty's Supreme Court of Judicature) the said Theophilus Percy Ring (with the consent of the said Farrer Baron Herschell Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain as such patron as aforesaid and of the said William Dalrymple Archbishop of York as the Ordinary aforesaid) did grant convey and confirm unto and to the use of the minister for the time being of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed thereto and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish then to the incumbent of such new parish and his successors the pieces or parcels of land hereinafter described (that is to say) all those twenty-seven several pieces or parcels of land (with the messuages or dwelling houses erections and buildings thereon) situate respectively in the parish of Acton in the county of Middlesex which are particularly described in the first schedule annexed to the said indenture and are also delineated and further described upon the plan drawn upon and forming part of the same indenture subject nevertheless to the several leases the particulars whereof and the yearly rents amounting altogether to three hundred pounds and eighteen shillings which are reserved thereby are set forth in the Second Schedule to the said indenture.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land with the messuages or dwelling-houses erections and buildings thereon subject to the leases aforesaid producing a yearly rental of three hundred pounds and eighteen shillings have been so granted conveyed and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Dalrymple Archbishop of the said diocese of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Masbrough which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and which is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Northfield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Farrer Baron Herschell Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting on behalf of Your Majesty in right of the Crown and by his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Northfield being:-

"All that part of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist Masbrough in the county of York and in the diocese of York which is bounded upon the greater part of the north-west by the new parish of Greasborough in the said county and diocese upon the north-east by the new parish of Christ Church Park Gate in the same county and diocese upon the south-east partly by the new parish of Saint Stephen Eastwood and partly by the parish of Rotherham both in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south and upon the remaining part of the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Rotherham from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Masbrough aforesaid. at the centre of the bridge over the River Don called Rotherham Bridge which connects Bridge Gate in Rotherham with Bridge-street in Masbrough and extending thence westward along the middle of the last - named street for a distance of eight and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with George-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Glasshouse-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the lastnamed street for a distance of ten and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tenterstreet and extending thence still north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of sixteen and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the bridge over the line of the Mildland Railway which is called or known as Robin Hood Bridge and which connects Tenter-street with Roger-street and continuing thence still north-westward along the middle of the said bridge to a point over the middle of the line of the Midland Railway aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of St. John the Evangelist Masbrough from the new parish of Greasborough aforesaid.'

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Masbrough out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.
