Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office,

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

SCHEME for the constitution of the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the county of the city of Newcastleupon-Tyne, and in the Diocese of Newcastle. To all to whom these presents shall come,

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting :

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Saint Mary's Hospital (Newcastle-upon-Tyne) Act 1888, it is enacted that so soon as the Master of the hospital shall cease to hold office, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, should prepare a scheme for the constitution of a new parish, to be called by the name of Saint Mary the Virgin, by the taking from any of the ecclesiastical districts or parishes adjacent to the chapel of Saint Mary the Virgin (Newcastle-upon-Tyne) such portions as we shall think expedient, having regard to the spiritual requirements of such districts or parishes.

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the said chapel shall be the church of the said proposed new parish when constituted.

And whereas the Reverend Robert Anchor Thompson, the late Master of the said hospital, died on the tenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

direct that, as from the date of the publication of this scheme in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than this scheme when so gazetted, all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul, High Elswick, and of the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Low Elswick, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and are set forth and described on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured respectively pink and green, shall together be formed into, and shall be constituted, a new parish for all spiritual purposes, by the name of "the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin" (Newcastle-upon-Tyne), and shall have all the rights and privileges of a new parish created under the New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844, and 1856 as amended by any subsequent Act.
