FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. (41 Vict., cap. 16, sec. 33.)

LIME WASHING, &C. Order of the Secretary of State granting Special

Exemption. WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act,

1878, section 33, as amended by the Factory and

Workshop Act, 1891, provides as follows:—

For the purpose of securing the observance of the requirements of this Act as to cleanliness in every factory, all the inside walls of the rooms of a factory, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms (whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not), and all the passages and staircases of a factory, if they have not been painted with oil or varnished once at least within seven years, shall be limewashed once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last limewashed; and if they have been so painted or varnished, shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last washed:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did, by Order dated the 20th December, 1882, direct that the regulations in section 33 should not apply to foundries:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that, as regards such foundries, the said Order should be amended:

Now I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, by this Order, rescind so much of the said Order of the 20th December, 1882, as relates to foundries, and I hereby grant to foundries, being non-textile factories or workshops, a Special Exception that the regulations in section 33 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, shall

not apply thereto, subject to the following provieo:

That, if any foundry is not in a cleanly state, an Inspector may, by written notice, require the occupier to limewash or wash the same; and, inthe event of the occupier failing to comply with such requisition within two months from the date of the notice, the special exception shall cease to apply to such foundry.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: -District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Districts and Duties (Supplemental):-

Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District. Bridgnorth and Wigmore Rural Districts.

To Sir Richard Dansey Green-Price, Baronet, District Auditor ;-

To the Rural District Council of each of the Rural Districts of Bridgnorth and Wig-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in

part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1883, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Richard Dansey Green-Price as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such Districts should be termed "The Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District'

And whereas it is prescribed by Article 2 of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the

following terms:

"(3.) The several other Authorities for the " time being whose Accounts are or may be " by law subject to be audited by a District

" Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas

"being wholly situated within the said " Audit District."

"(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose " Accounts are or may be by law subject to " be so audited, and whose Districts or the " areas of whose jurisdiction are for the. "time being partly situated within the said "Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe."

And whereas the Rural District Council of each of the said Rural Districts of Bridgmorth and Wigmore is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of each of the said Rural District Councils is partly situated within the said

Audit District:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Richard Dansey Green-Price to audit the Accounts of earth of the said Rural District Councile, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of each of the said Rural District Councils shall be deemed to be within the said Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District.
