TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Koom is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty. The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894, upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk, I hereby make the following orders : -

I. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of one year from the 1st day of May, 1895, within the following areas:

Hickling Broad, Whitesley and Heigham Sounds, Blackfleet Broad, Horsey Mere, Martham and Somerton Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the Islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith, including the Hundred Stream or Thurne River and ancient bed, and the rands and walls thereof from Heigham Bridge to the sea at Winterton, and all the marshes and low-lying and uncultivated lands, fens, reed grounds, warrens, maram or sand-hills, and sea shore, to the line of high water mark in the several parishes of Waxham, Horsey, Potter Heigham, and Hickling, and such part of the parish of Catfield as lies to the east of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway;

The warrens, maram or sand-hills, and sea

shore to the line of high water mark, in the parish of Winterton;
And the series of Broads, known as Ormesby, Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens, reed grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water, in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad, in the parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

II. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of one year, from the 1st day of May, 1895, within the following areas, viz.:—The whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand-bills, salt marshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separating the foreshore from them, from the estuary sluice at North Wootton to the eastern boundary of the parish of Cleynext-the-Sea.

III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire county of Norfolk, viz.-

1. The Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant Panurus biarmicus).

2. The Crossbill (Loxia curvirostris).

3. The White or Barn Owl (Strix flammea).

Wild Ducks and Teal of all species. 5. The Norfolk Plover, Stone Curlew or Thickknee (Œdicnemus scolopax).

6. Ruff or Reeve (Machetes pugnax).

7. The Ring Dotterel, Ring Plover or Stone Runner (Agialitis hiaticula).

8. Oyster Catcher or Sea-pie (Hæmatopus ostralegus).

9. The Terns, Sea Swallows, Pearls or Dipears (Sterna), all species.

10. The Great Crested Grebe or Loon (Podicipes cristatus).

IV. The "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the county of Norfolk to the Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant and the Crossbill, as if these two species of Wild Birds had been included in the schedule to the said Act.

The foregoing orders shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1895.

County Borough of Birkenhead. Birkenhead Corporation Tramways.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the county borough of Birkenhead, hereinafter called "the Corporation," intend, with the consent of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions of "The Tramways Act 1870" by lease to be approved by the Board of Trade, to demise to the Wirral Tramway Company, Limited, hereinafter called "the Company" the right of user by the Company of the tramways in the said borough belonging to the Corporation situated and laid in the following street and road, namely:—

Chester-street, from the junction of the Woodside Ferry approach road with Chester-street to the junction of Chester-street with New Chester-

New Chester-road, from the junction of Chesterstreet with New Chester-road to the southern boundary of the borough,

And of demanding and taking in respect of the same, the tolls and charges authorized and mentioned in the lease.

The term of the proposed lease is twenty-one years to be computed from the 11th day of March, 1895. The rent reserved by the proposed lease is as follows:—If or the first five years of the said term the yearly rent of £383 9s. 3d., and for the remaining sixteen years of the said term the yearly rent of £410 17s. 0d.

The several rents to be paid free from all deductions quarterly in advance.

The proposed Lease contains covenants by the Company to pay the rents reserved and all taxes. to observe the obligations of the said "Tramways Act, 1870," and to observe, perform, and fulfil all provisions, stipulations, or agreements contained in any Acts of Parliament which now or may hereafter affect the user of the tramways or any part thereof, to indemnify the Corporation against any breach thereof, and to deliver up the premises at the expiration or sooner determina-tion of the term. That the Company will not use power other than animal power on the tramways without the previous consent of the Corporation, and will only run such carriages as shall be approved by the Corporation, and will maintain their carriages in good condition; that the Company will not charge for the conveyance of passengers any fare greater than the fares authorized by the Wirral Tramways Order, 1874, that section 24 of that Order shall apply to and be binding on the Company; and that the Company shall not make any charge for the carriage of the personal luggage of any passengers travelling on the tramways so long as such luggage does not exceed 28 lbs. in weight. That the Company will observe and perform the provisions of section 27 of the Wirral Tramways Order, 1874, regulating the hours at which carriages shall be run upon the tramways; that the Corporation may use the tramways in the hours between midnight and five o'clock in the morning for sanitary and other public purposes: that the Company will not use or permit the use of the tramways for the conveyance of any animals, goods, minerals or parcels, other than passengers and passengers' luggage, without the consent of the Corporation; that the Company will not during the term of the lease remove, destroy, alter or interfere with the rails, sidings or junctions; that the Company shall be answerable for all damage to the tramways and will indemnify the Corporation against damages in respect of accidents, damages, and injuries; that the Company will grant free passes for the use of the Corporation inspectors of tramways, and notify the Corporation if the rails shall be out of repair; that the Company will observe and enforce all bye-laws and regulations of the Corporation and be subject to all penalties for breach of the same; and that the Company will not assign, underlet, or part with. the possession of the rights and tramways without the consent of the Corporation.

The proposed lease contains covenants by the Corporation for quiet enjoyment of the liberties and premises by the Company, to maintain, repair and renew the tramways, and roads, and a proviso for distress and re-entry by the Corporation in case of default by the Company, in the payment of the rent reserved, with power to enter into and upon the premises demised, and to distrain all or any carriages, wagons, horses, or any other goods and things of the Company, also to receive and take the tolls during the continuance of such possession, and in case of bankruptcy or insolvency of the Company power is reserved to the Corporation to enter into possession of the premises and terminate the lease. And the said intended lease contains provisions authorizing the Corporation to execute repairs and works on the streets or tramways without incurring a liability to compensate the Company, to regulate street traffic, to construct temporary tramways during repairs, and reserving the rights of the Corporation generally, and providing that the proposed lease shall be deemed to be a lease under the 19th section of "The Tram-

ways Act, 1870."

The Schedule to the proposed lease contains a description of the lines of tramways to be leased.

A plan is attached.

The proposed lease is now deposited for public inspection during office hours in the Town Clerk's office, within the Town Hall, Hamilton-square, Birkenhead, and may be there seen and inspected on week days between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and five o'clock in the afternoon, except on Saturdays, when it may be seen and inspected between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and one o'clock in the afternoon.

London Building Act, 1894.

Dwelling-houses on Low-lying Lands.

OTICE is hereby given that the London County Council, acting under section 122 of the London Building Act, 1894, has made the following regulation with respect to the erection of dwelling-houses or the adaptation of buildings for use as dwelling-houses on low-lying land:—

It shall not be lawful to place the underside of the lowest floor of any permitted building at such a level as will render it liable to flooding, and every permitted building shall be efficiently and properly drained, to the satisfaction of the engineer for the time being of the Council, either into a local sewer or into a main sewer of the Council.

And further that the Council, acting under section 123 of the aforesaid Act, has with the concurrence of the Tribunal of Appeal constituted under section 175 of the Act made the following regulations prescribing the procedure to be followed by applicants for permission to erect or adapt dwelling-houses on low-lying land:—

Every person who shall be desirous of erecting or adapting any building to be used wholly or in part as a dwelling-house on any land in the county of London of which the surface is below the level of Trinity high-water mark, and which is so situate as not to admit of being drained by gravitation into an existing sewer of the Council, shall first make a written application for a licence. Such application shall be addressed to the Clerk of the Council.

Such application shall contain a statement as to the nature and extent of the interest of the applicant in the building or buildings proposed to be erected or adapted, and be accompanied by a plan and section of the lowest floor of such building or buildings and the curtilages thereof, to a scale of $\frac{1}{8}$ th of an inch to a foot, and by a block plan to a scale of not less than $\frac{1}{2600}$ (which may be on a sheet or sheets of the Ordnance Survey, or may be drawn on tracing linen), showing the position of such building or buildings, and the local sewer into which it is proposed to drain such building or buildings, and the connection of such local sewer with an existing sewer of the Council.

Such plans and sections shall be accompanied by a description of the materials to be used in the construction of such building or buildings, and shall be coloured in accordance therewith. The points of the compass shall be marked on the block plan.

The position and course of the drainage system proposed to be adopted for the disposal of sewage and rain water, and its connection with the local sewer or an existing sewer of the Council, shall be clearly shown on the plans and sections, and

the diameter and inclination of the drain pipes shall be figured thereon.

The plan and section shall also indicate in figures the level above or below ordnance datum at which it is proposed to construct the floor of the lowest rooms.

The decision given by the chief engineer of the Council upon such application shall be reported to the Building Act Committee, and the Committee shall report it to the Council, and thereupon, if it is to the effect that the erection or adaptation may not be permitted, the Clerk of the Council shall by letter inform the applicant that the Council, acting upon the decision of the engineer, has refused permission. If it is to the effect that the erection or adaptation may be permitted, a licence under the seal of the Council embodying the conditions of the engineer's decision shall be issued to the applicant.
