**TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.**

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered

to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200 at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

and Saint George, which happened on the 9th day of October last, the dignity of Earl Grey devolved upon Albert Henry George, Earl Grey, as second but eldest surviving son and heir of Charles Grey, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Charles Grey, General in the Army, who, whilst living, was the brother and heir presumptive of the said Henry, late Earl Grey, whereby, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the sister of the said Albert Henry George, now Earl Grey, cannot enjoy that title, rank, place, and precedence which would have been due to her had her father, the said Charles Grey, survived his said brother and succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl Grey, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Victoria Alexandrina Elizabeth, wife of Lewis Payn Dawnay, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Lewis Payn Dawnay, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Royal Regiment of Coldstream Guards, and late Representative in Parliament for the Thirsk and Malton Division of Yorkshire, the sister of the said Albert Henry George, now Earl Grey, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if her father, the said Charles Grey, had survived his brother, the said Henry, late Earl Grey, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl Grey:

And to command that the said order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1878 to 1891.

WHEREAS by Section 8 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that:—

"Where the Secretary of State certifies that in his opinion any machinery or process or particular description of manual labour used in a factory or workshop (other than a domestic workshop) is dangerous or injurious to health, or dangerous to life or limb, either generally or in the case of women, children, or any other class of persons, or that the provision for the admission of fresh air is not sufficient, or that the quantity of dust generated or inhaled in any factory or workshop is dangerous or injurious to health, the Chief Inspector may serve on the occupier of the factory or workshop a notice in writing, either proposing such special rules or requiring the adoption of such special measures as appear to the Chief Inspector to be reasonably practicable, and to meet the necessities of the case."

Now I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion such processes carried on in factories and work-

shops, or parts thereof, as are named in the Schedule hereunder, are dangerous or injurious to health.

Processes in which yellow chromate of lead is used or in which goods dyed with it undergo the process of bundling or noddling, winding, reeling, weaving or any other treatment.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the twenty-first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three approving of and defining a part of the Port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.
