NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Monday, the 1st of July next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE following General Order, dated 15th March, 1895, together with a despatch from Brigadier-General A. H. Turner regarding the operations of the Waziristan Delimitation Escort, including the attack on the camp at Wano, has been received from the Government of India:—

FIELD OPERATIONS.—WAZIRISTAN.

THE Right Honourable the Viceroy and Governor-General of India in Council directs the publication of the subjoined letters from the Adjutant-General in India, submitting, under the orders of the Commander-in-Chief in India, despatches from Brigadier-General A. H. Turner relating to the operations of the force under his command from the 1st October to the 29th November, 1894, including the attack made by the Mahsud Waziris on the camp at Wano on the 3rd November, 1894.

I HAVE the honour, by direction of the Commander-in-Chief, to forward, for the information of the Government of India, the enclosed despatch* from Brigadier-General A. H. Turner of the operations of the Waziristan Delimitation Escort from the 1st October, 1894, including the attack made by the Mahsud Waziris on the camp at Wano on the 3rd November.

No. 99, dated Camp Wano, 16th November, 1894. From Brigadier-General A. H. Turner, Commanding Waziristan Delimitation Escort, to the Adjutant-General in India.

I HAVE the honour to forward, for the information of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in India, the following report on the operations of the brigade forming the escort to the Waziristan Delimitation Commission from the 1st October up to, and including, the attack made by the Mahsud Waziris on our camp on the morning of the 3rd November.

2. In accordance with the orders of the Government of India, the brigade, consisting of the troops
