THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, enclosing the following Quarantine Notice issued by the Swedish Government, viz. :—

(Translation.)  
Cholera Regulations.

His Majesty has decreed that—

Posts of observation be established at Bredvik off Umeå, at Juniskären off Sundsvall, on the Islands of Feja and Harö in the Stockholm Archipelago, at Arkö in the Östergotland Archipelago, at Vestra Häs holmen in the Karl-krona Archipelago, on the Island of Hven in the Öresund, and at Köpstadö in the Gothenburg Archipelago :

That should cholera break out in the Russian ports on the Baltic, the stations at Bredvik, Juniskären, on the Islands Feja and Harö, at Arkö and at Vestra Häs holmen should be put on an active footing :

That should cholera break out in Denmark the post of observation on the Island of Hven shall be put on an active footing :

That should cholera break out in the German ports on the Baltic all the last-named stations should be put on an active footing :

That should cholera break out in Great Britain the post of observation at Köpstadö shall be put on an active footing.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board : Qualification of Dispenser: Altering Regulations :—

39 Unions and Separate Parishes.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and several Parishes named in Schedules A and B to this Order ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Unions and Separate Parishes named in Schedules A and B to this Order the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board prescribed Rules and Regulations with respect to the management of Dispensaries provided for such Unions and Parishes or for certain Districts thereof, and made provision, amongst other things, with regard to the qualification of Dispensers ;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision as regards the qualification of persons hereafter appointed to the office of dispenser should be made as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the said Orders as prescribes the qualification of the Dispensers appointed thereunder is hereby rescinded.

ARTICLE II.—We hereby Order, with regard to the qualification of any person who may be hereafter appointed under the said Orders by the Guardians of the Poor of any of the said Unions or separate Parishes to the office of Dispenser at any Dispensary of such Union or Parish, as follows; namely,—

No person shall be qualified to be appointed a Dispenser unless he shall be a Licentiate of the Society of Apothecaries of London, or shall hold a Certificate of that Society as to his qualification to act as an Assistant in compounding and dispensing medicines, or shall be a compounder of medicines duly qualified in accordance with the Regulations for the Army Medical Staff Corps, or shall have been duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, or shall have been duly registered under the Pharmacy Act (Ireland), 1875, and the Pharmacy Act (Ireland), 1875, Amendment Act, 1890, as qualified to compound medical prescriptions.
