**PORT OF LIVERPOOL TRANSHIPMENT ORDER OF 1895.**

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture animals brought from Her Majesty's Possessions in North America or from the United States of America to the Port of Liverpool may be transhipped in the River Mersey from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to a Foreign Animals Wharf in the port of Liverpool, subject to the following conditions :

*First.* That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the animals are transhipped is specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying the animals.

*Second.* That the owner, agent, or charterer of the landing-vessel has received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

2. The animals shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to the Foreign Animals Wharf, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated.

5.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately

after each occasion of use, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows :

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which animals or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

6. Animals transhipped under this Order shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

8. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that the revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, before the commencement of this Order.

9. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

11. This Order may be cited as THE PORT OF LIVERPOOL TRANSHIPMENT ORDER OF 1895.

**PORT OF LONDON TRANSHIPMENT ORDER OF 1895.**

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture animals brought from

Her Majesty's Possessions in North America or from the United States of America or from Australia or from New Zealand to the port of London may be transhipped in the River Thames or in any Dock in the port of London from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford, subject to the following conditions :

*First.* That the vessel (in this Order called the
