Urban District of Harrow-on-the-Hill.

Harrow Electric Lighting Order, 1894.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Harrow-on-
the-Hill Urban District Council, successors
to the Harrow Local Board, intend in pursuance
of the powers given them by the Harrow Electric
Lighting Order 1894 and with the consent of the
Board of Trade, to transfer their powers duties
and liabilities under the said Order to the Harrow
Electric Light and Power Company Limited.

The area in respect of which the transfer is
proposed to be made is the area of supply as defined
by the first Schedule to the said Order.

The period for which the transfer is proposed to
be made is 42 years from the date of the transfer.

The pecuniary consideration in respect of the
transfer is £341 12s. 2d. being the amount expen-
ded by the Harrow Local Board in relation to
the said Order.

The powers duties or liabilities of the Under-
takers set forth in the following sections of the
said Order are proposed to be excepted from the
transfer, viz. :—

Sec. 7. As to purchase and use of lands.

Sec. 28. As to remuneration of Electric In-
spectors.

Sec. 52. As to application of revenue.

Sec. 53. As to application of capital moneys.

Sec. 54. So far as relates to the authentication
of any notice or document by the Council.

Sec. 59. Transfer of powers &c. save as pro-
vided in proposed Deed of Transfer.

Sec. 68. Incorporating sections 264 and 265
of the Public Health Act 1875.

The transfer is also proposed to be made subject
to the power of the Council at the expiration of
the first 21 years of the said term or of every
subsequent period of seven years to purchase the
Undertaking lands buildings works machinery and
plant of the Company on the terms specified in the
proposed Deed of Transfer.

The transfer is proposed to be made upon the
following terms viz. :—Audit under Board of
Trade; Power to Board of Trade to revise prices,
&c.; Protection of Council on interfering with
Roads Bridges, &c.; Power to Company to
acquire Land; Provisions for lighting Public
Lamps; Supply by Company to Council of Map
of Area of Supply; Restriction against placing
Wires above ground; Provisions for enabling
Council to purchase Undertaking if Company
fail in material respects to work it as required by
the Electric Lighting Acts and the said Order.

A copy of the said draft Deed of Transfer is
deposited for public inspection and printed copies
thereof are on sale at the price of sixpence for
each copy at the offices of the Harrow-on-the-
Hill Urban District Council High-street Harrow.
