MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

SWINE - FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM IRELAND) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1895 (No. 4).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 continued until 30th November

1. The Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 shall be read and have effect as if the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five were substituted for the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four in Article 1 of that Order, as the date from and immediately after which that Order shall cease to operate, and the operation of that Order which was continued by subsequent Orders is hereby further continued accordingly.

Existing Regulations of Local Authority.

2. Any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 as continued by subsequent Orders and in force on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall, unless altered or revoked by such Local Authority, remain in force until the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

#### Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Swine-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM IRELAND) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1895 (No. 4).

NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE (OUSEBURN) LANDING-PLACE ORDER OF 1895.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of and define the following part of the Port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or

All that piece of ground lying between Ouse-street and the New Quay on the west and the Ouseburn on the east, in the East Ward of the parish of All Saints, in the city and county of Newcastleupon-Tyne, comprising an area of cleven thousand and eighteen square yards or thereabouts (including the approaches from the Landing Quay) bounded by a line commencing at a point marked A on the plan of the said landing-place deposited

#### No. 474.—CHINA SEA.

Singapore Main Strait—Beacons and Rock.

INFORMATION has been received from Captain W. H. Fawkes, Her Majesty's ship "Mercury," dated 21st July, 1895, of the undermentioned particulars relating to beacons and a rock, among the islands in Singapore Main Strait :-

1. The beacon previously situated at the northwest extreme of Tree Island (Po. Angup) Reef, or in approximately latitude 1° 9' 30" N., longitude 103° 39′ 35″ E., has disappeared.

2. The beacon previously situated on the rock about half a mile south-eastward of Middle Island (Po. Sabárut), or in approximately lat. 1° 12′ N., long. 103° 48′ 35″ E. has disappeared.

3. A coral reef, about half a cable in length north-west and south-east and very narrow, with a depth of 2 to 3 feet on it at low water springs, and deep water all round, lies N. 33° E., distant two cables, from the south point of Freshwater Island (Po. Bukum); or approximately in lat. 1° 13′ 55″ N., long. 103° 47′ 0″ E.

Two masonry beacons, each about 2 feet above high water, and surmounted by a staff and cage 12 feet high, and bearing N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. from each other, mark the extremes of this reef.

4. Two similar beacons also mark the northwest and south-east sides of the isolated rock lying east, distant about seven cables, from the north point of Freshwater Island, or approximately in lat. 1° 14′ 25″ N., long. 103° 46′ 40" E.
