ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 30TH AUGUST 1895.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED PLACE.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of September; one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
