No. 502.—NORWAY—WEST COAST.

(1.) *Sunken Rocks in Rovde Fiord.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, dated August, 1895, of the existence of the under-mentioned dangers recently discovered in Rovde Fiord:—

A sunken rock with 2 feet water over it lies $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables E.N.E. of Rovdeskär.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 11' 0''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 45' 5''$ E.

A sunken rock with 13 feet water over it lies $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. of Rovdeskär.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 44' 35''$ E.

Ausegrund Rock with 3 feet over it lies half a cable south of Ansa, near Oksnö.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 13' 20''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 53' 10''$ E.

Skärgrunden Rock with 2 feet over it lies $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables N.W. by W. from the south-west point of Oksnö.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 13' 30''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 52' 50''$ E.

Klepholmflua Rock with 3 feet over it lies one cable S.S.E. of West Klepholmen.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 14' 10''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 50' 5''$ E.

From the largest Islet north-east of Maalö, a reef with 4 feet extends towards Guleskär.

Approximate position of Eastern End, lat. $62^{\circ} 14' 10''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 50' 50''$ E.

(2.) *Hustad Viken—Sunken Rocks.*

Skallen Rock, with 4 fathoms over it, lies 2 cables N.W. from Lyroddene.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 57' 30''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 54' 0''$ E.

Sküärflua has a depth of 4 fathoms over it, where 6 fathoms is now charted.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 58' 25''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 54' 50''$ E.

Stolen Rock, with 4 fathoms over it, lies about 3 cables W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from Svorva.

Approximate position, lat. $62^{\circ} 58' 20''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 56' 10''$ E.

LIVERPOOL.

Submarine Telegraph from Formby Light-vessel to Crosby Lighthouse.

THE Mersey Docks and Harbour Board has given notice, dated 5th September, 1895, that, during the present month, an electric telegraph cable will be laid from Formby Light-vessel to Crosby Lighthouse.

The cable will be laid from Formby Light-vessel towards C 2 black can buoy, thence, southward of C 3 and C 4 black can buoys, and on to Formby Channel towards F 6 red conical buoy, and thence across Formby Bank to Crosby Lighthouse.

Vessels must not anchor or trawl in the vicinity of the cable.
