Madrid Gazette, October 8, 1895. Ministry of the Interior.

Whereas it is officially notified to this Ministry that the state of public health in Aleppo is satisfactory and that cholera has appeared in Zeitomne, near Marash, in Mesopotamia (Turkey in Asia):

The King, &c., &c., &c., has been pleased to dispose that the Royal Order of August 24 last declaring foul the Port of Alexandretta owing to the appearance of cholera in Aleppo be annulled, and that ports in the Gulf of Iskanderun or Alexandretta, being less than 165 kilometres from Zeitomne, be declared as specially suspected.

In virtue whereof vessels proceeding from the above mentioned gulf and arriving after the publication of this Royal Order shall be subjected to three days' quarantine observation.
