Thames Conservancy.

Proposed Bye-Laws for the Regulation of the Passage through the Tower Bridge of such Vessels as require the Raising of the Bascules.

WHEREAS the Conservators of the River Thames caused the above mentioned proposed Bye-laws to be published in the London Gazette of the 16th day of July 1895 and as an advertisement in the Times newspaper of the 17th and 24th days of July 1895.
