ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH OCTOBER 1895.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order of the Board dated the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, prohibiting the sale or exposure for sale of any cattle, sheep, or swine in or at certain Market-places and Sale-yards in the county of Gloucester, shall not, after the date of this Order, apply to the Market-places or Sale-yard named in the Schedule to this Order, and the first-mentioned Order is hereby revoked.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, such Order before the date of this Order.

No. 574.—AFRICA—EAST COAST.

River Chinde Entrance—Condition of Land-marks.

INFORMATION has been received from Lieutenant and Commander H. V. W. Elliott, Her Majesty's ship "Magpie," dated 17th September, 1895, that the tall palm, formerly standing on the north side of the entrance to River Chinde, about one mile W.N.W. from Mitaone Point, has disappeared.

Also, that the beacons on Mitaone Point have been blown down; and two bare poles erected there, which are no guide to the channel over the bar.

No. 575.—NORWAY.

(1.) *Rekefiord—Intended Alterations in Lights.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice that, on 1st November, 1895, the undermentioned alterations will be made in the lights shown at Rekefiord:—

a. Lille Præstskjær Light will be a new, third order, group-flashing light, showing three flashes in quick succession every six seconds, thus:—white flash, red flash, white flash. It will be elevated 77 feet above high water, 68 feet above the ground, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

The lighthouse is an iron tower, painted red, situated on the Eastern Præste Rock, on the west side of the entrance to Rekefiord.

Approximate position, lat. $58^{\circ} 19' 25''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 15' 40''$ E.

b. An auxiliary fixed red light will be shown from the same lighthouse, visible, over Boen, for a distance of 6 miles in clear weather.

c. The sector of red light, now shown from Rekefiord (Ganvigodden) Lighthouse over Boen, will be discontinued.

(2.) *Intended Alteration in Fog Signal at Torbiørnskier Lighthouse.*

Also that, on 1st November, 1895, the fog signal at Torbiørnskier Lighthouse will be altered from a bell to a horn, which, during thick or foggy weather will give five blasts every minute, each blast being of two to three seconds duration and separated by similar intervals of silence.

Ona Island—Intended Occulting Light on Husöen.

THE Norwegian Government has given notice that, on 5th January, 1895, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Husöen, western side of Ona Island:—

Husöen Light will be an occulting light, with the following sectors:—White from S. 17° E. (eastward of Bratskallen and Gravskjær) to S. 13° E.; red from S. 13° E. to S. 6° E. (over Løiken, a shoal of four fathoms); and white from S. 6° E., through south, to S. 1° W. (westward of Oddene); the last sector also shows over a rock, with a depth of ten fathoms on it, which breaks with a heavy sea.

The light is elevated eighty feet above high water, and visible from a distance of six miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is ten feet in height.

SINGAPORE STRAIT.

(1.) *Sunken Rock in Sumpat Bay.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 24th September, 1895, of the existence of a rock of small extent, with a depth of 2½ fathoms on it at low water, recently found by the surveying vessel "Melvill van Carnbee," lying with Po. On leaving Pallada Road, two white, masonry beacons, bearing when in line N.E. ½ E. (N. 51° E.), on Klikova Point, were observed from Her Majesty's ship "Edgar"; and a spar buoy, surmounted by a broom, point downwards, was moored near the reported locality of the rock.

(westward of Grejpingenskier) through south, to S. 6° W. It is elevated 125 feet above the sea, and shown from a building ten feet high.

4. Jejtingen Light is an occulting light with the following sectors:—Red from S. 52° E. to S. 82° E. (southward of the rock southward of

Vasjetting); white from S. 82° E., through east, to N. 65° E.; red from N. 65° E. to N. 58° E. (over Børsklakken); white from N. 58° E. to N. 29° E.; and red from N. 39° E. (westward of Sejefu) to N. 13° E. A red sector is also shown from N. 75° W. (southward of rocks off Rottevaagö), through west, to S. 14° W. It is elevated 44 feet above high water, and shown from a building ten feet high.

Approximate position, lat. 60° 34' 45" N., long. 4° 47' 50" E.

5. Maaßen Light is an occulting light with the following sectors:—Red from S. 3° W. (westward of Svertling), through south to S. 74° E. (southward of S.
