New Rocks Westward of Silby.

THE Russian Government has given notice, date 1 5th October, 1895, of the existence of the undermentioned rocks, not previously known, westward of Sidby:—

1. A rock, now named Höjer Südgrund, with a depth of 20 feet on it, and half a cable in extent, lies with Sidby Church bearing S. 47° E., distant 7½ miles, or approximately in lat. 62° 6′ 25″ N., long. 21° 7′ 45″ E.

It is marked on its south-west side by a spar

buoy, with a flag.

2. A rock, now named Rockaboll Stidgrund, with a depth of 5 feet on it, and of very small extent, lies with Sidby Church bearing S. 85° E., distant 6-10 miles, or approximately in latitude 62° 1′ 55″ N., longitude 21° 7′ 25″ E.
