

200 yards inland from these, with a flagstaff in front of the last, and of the northern of those near the shore.

The beacon on Penguin Island and the cross on Nautilus Hill are not easily distinguished from seaward; and the flagstaff, previously standing on the summit of Seal Island, has been blown down.

Intended Alteration in Position of Whistle Buoy Southward of Cape Ann.

THE United States Government has given notice that, on or about 25th October, 1895, the whistle-buoy (black and white vertical stripes) now moored about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, S.S.E., from Eastern Point Lighthouse, Cape Ann, will be moved to a position about E.S.E., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from Thatcher's Island Lighthouses, Cape Ann, or approximately in lat. $42^{\circ} 37\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $70^{\circ} 31'$ W. [Variation 13° Westerly in 1895.]
