In the Matter of the Manchester and Liverpool District Banking Company Limited and in the Matter of the Companies (Memorandum of Association) Act 1890.

NOTICE is hereby given that a petition was on the 27th day of July 1895 presented to Her Majesty's High Court of Justice by the above named Company to confirm a Special Resolution unanimously passed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company held on the 10th day of July 1895 and subsequently unanimously confirmed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the said Company held on the 25th day of July 1895 as follows:—"That pursuant to the provisions of the Companies (Memorandum of Association) Act 1890 the form of the Company's constitution be altered by substituting the Memorandum of Association (with extended objects) and Articles of Association which have already been submitted to and approved by the Meeting for the Company's Deed of Settlement of the 22nd of February 1843 and for all regulations of the Company subsequently made and now in force." * Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the local inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure that officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
