1. The sale or exposure for sale of any swine in or at George Andrews' sale-yard at the Hoste Arms Hotel, Burnham Market, in the county of Norfolk, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a pig is sold or exposed for sale in or at the said sale-yard at Burnham Market in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale at such sale-yard, and the purchaser thereat of any pig so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order such purchaser knowing the pig to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
