Tramway No. 4, which will be a double line throughout, and for a part of its length in substitution for a portion of the existing tramways, commencing in the parish of Cottingham, at a point 0.20 chain or thereabouts southward from the intersection of the centre lines of Queen's-road and Prince's-avenue, passing thence in a southerly

direction along Prince's-avenue and easterly into and along Spring-bank, on or near the boundary between the parish of Sculcoates and the united parishes of Holy Trinity and St. Mary, and part in the said united parishes, and south-easterly into and along Prospect-street, and terminating in the last-named street, in the parish of Sculcoates, by a junction with the existing tramways at the intersection of the centre lines of Pearson-street and Prospect-street.

Tramway No. 5, which will be a double line throughout, in substitution for a portion of the existing tramways, commencing in the parish of Cottingham, at a point 0.35 chain or thereabouts southward from the intersection of the centre lines of Cottinghamroad and Beverley-road, passing thence in a southerly direction along Beverley-road, and terminating therein, in the parish of Sculcoates, by a junction with the existing tramways, at the intersection of the centre lines of Marlborough-terrace and Beverley-road.

In Junction-street and west approach of Whitefriargate-bridge, on both sides thereof, from a point 0.15 chain south-eastward from the intersection of the centre lines of Waterworks-street and Junction-street to the termination of Tramway No. 7.

Tramway No. 8, in the east approach to Whitefriargate - bridge, Whitefriargate, Silver-street, and Market-place, on both sides thereof, from the commencement of the tramway to a point 0.50 chain southward of the intersection of the centre lines of Church-lane and Market-place, also in Market-place on the east side thereof from the said point 0.50 chain southward of the intersection of the centre lines of Church-lane and Market-place to a point 1.15 chains southward of the said intersection.

Tramway No. 9, in Queen-street, on both sides thereof, from the intersection of the centre lines of Blanket-row and Queen-street to a point 0.55 chain northward from the intersection of the centre lines of Queen-street and Nelson-street.

Tramway No. 10, in Charlotte-street, on both sides thereof, from the intersection of the centre lines of Wincolmlee and Charlotte-street to the termination of Tramway No. 10.

Tramway No. 11, in Witham, on both sides thereof, from a point 1.80 chains north-eastward from the intersection of the centre lines of Great Union-street and Witham to a point 5.15 chains westward from the intersection of the centre lines of Malton-street and Witham.

In Holderness-road, on both sides thereof, from a point 0.60 chain north-eastward from the intersection of the centre lines of Dansom-lane and Holderness-road to a point 1.40 chains north-eastward from the intersection of the centre lines of Wiltonstreet and Holderness-road.
