THE Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration, that upon the decease of Skeffington James, Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, in the Peerage of Ireland, which happened on the 7th day of September, 1895, the dignity of Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal devolved upon James Frederick, now Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, as the eldest son of Robert Daly, Esq., commonly called the Honourable Robert Daly, who whilst living was the brother and heir presumptive of the said Skeffington James, Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, whereby, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the sisters of the said James Frederick, Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, cannot enjoy that title, rank, place, and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father survived his brother and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Florence Maria Daly and Elinor Gertrude Daly the sisters of the said James Frederick, now Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the title, rank, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as the daughters of a Baron, to which honour they would have been entitled had their father succeeded to the dignity of Baron Dunsandle and Clan Conal:

And to command that the said order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
