HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Monday, the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fiftyninth year of Our reign.

No. 685—SOLOMON ISLANDS.

Shoals on East Coast of Mala (Malaita) Island. INFORMATION has been received from Commander E. G. Rason, Her Majesty's ship "Royalist." dated 12th September, 1895, of the existence of the undermentioned shoals on the cast coast of Mala (Malaita) Island:—

1. A shoal, apparently coral, on which a sounding of $4\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms was obtained (possibly there may be less water), lies in the northern entrance to Maramisike Passage, with Pyramid Island bearing east, distant $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles; an l Annuta Island about S. 25° W.

Approximate position, lat. 9° 16' S., long. 161° 14' E.

2. A shoal, on which a sounding of 5 fathoms was obtained, but probably there is less water, lies with South Sister Island bearing about W.S.W., distant 2 miles, or approximately in lat. 9° 8′ S., long. 161° 12′ E.

The extent of this shoal is doubtful, and a wide berth should be given to the Sister Islands, until the locality has been thoroughly examined.

No. 686.—PHILIPPINE ISLANDS. Shoals in St. Bernardino Strait.

THE Spanish Government has given notice, dated 26th September, 1895, of the existence of the undermentioned shoals northward and southward of Dulampiri (Puercos), St. Bernardino Strait:—

1. A shoal of sand and coral, with depths of less than five fathoms on it, extends for a distance of two miles northward of the north point of Dulampiri, and has depths of 11 fathoms for a distance of half a mile further northward.

Approximate position, north extreme of five fathoms, lat. 12° 30′ N., long. 124° 13½′ E.

2. A similar shoal extends southward from the southern point of Dulampiri, the five fathoms limit being at a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and the 11 fathoms limit 2 miles from the south point.

3. This shoal, now named Rubi Shoal, is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables in extent east and west, with a depth of about 6 fathoms on it (possibly there may be less water), and deep water close around. It lies N. 79° W., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from El Diamante, or approximately in lat. $12^{\circ}20\frac{3}{4}$ N., long. $124^{\circ}10\frac{1}{4}$ E.

Banks North-West of Uea or Wallis Islands.
