A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Monday, the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fiftyninth year of Our reign.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Wednesday, the twelfth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the Right Honoufable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

THE following Statute, made on the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, by the Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of those present and voting, and sealed on the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:"—

STATUTE to alter the Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners for Merton College on the sixteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and approved by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; which amending Statute was duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the thirty-first day of October one thousand eight; hundred and ninety-five, and having been passed at such General Meeting by the votes of not less than two thirds of the number of persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council. We the Warden and Fellows of Merton College in the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," do hereby alter the Statutes so made by the University of Oxford Commissioners as aforesaid in manner following that is to say:—

By substituting in Statute III, 8, for subsection d. the following subsection to form an amended subsection of such Statute.

Stat. III, 8, d. Not more than three Fellows elected or re-elected under subsections i and ii of clause 7, shall hold Fellowships at one time by virtue of such election or re-election.
