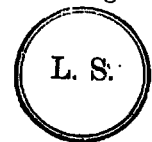

LIVERPOOL RESHIPMENT STATION REVOCATION ORDER OF 1895.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four defusing a part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals quarantine station for the purposes of a Reshipment Station: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.

This Order may be cited as the LIVERPOOL RESHIPMENT STATION REVOCATION ORDER OF 1895.
