THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 14th December, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, enclosing the following Circular relating to sanitary precautions adopted in Bulgaria:—

Ministère des Affaires Etrangères et des Cultes,
Sofia, le $\frac{2}{14}$ Décembre, 1895.

Vu l'apparition du choléra en Turquie (Asie Mineure), Egypte, Russie et Galicie, le Conseil Sanitaire de la Principauté dans sa séance du $\frac{17}{29}$ courant (sic) a pris les décisions suivantes:

1. Seront considérés comme indemnes du choléra et obtiendront la libre pratique dans les ports bulgares les bateaux qui, arrivant d'Egypte et d'Asie Mineure, ont subi la quarantaine, soit à Constantinople, soit dans un autre port quaran-

tenaire de l'Empire Ottoman, et ceux qui, venant de ports non contaminés n'ont eu à bord ni avant le départ, ni pendant la traversée, aucun cas de choléra.

2. Les bateaux et barques qui, au moment de leur départ d'un port contaminé ont eu à bord quelque cas de choléra qui ne s'est pas répété pendant sept jours consécutifs seront soumis:—

(a.) À l'inspection médicale.

(b.) À la désinfection du linge et des habits sales et des utensiles appartenant tant aux passagers qu'à l'équipage; cette désinfection aura lieu dans le cas où les autorités quaranténaires constateraient que les effets en question sont contaminés.

(c.) Les cales seront vidées, désinfectées avec soin et remplies de nouveau avec de l'eau douce et pure.

(d.) Les voyageurs seront soumis à une observation médicale de 5 jours à domicile, l'équipage sera soumis durant 5 jours à une visite médicale.

(e.) Il est défendu à l'équipage de descendre à terre, sauf le cas de grande nécessité pour le service.

3. Seront considérés comme contaminés les bateaux et les barques qui ont à bord des cas de choléra vu qui en ont eu depuis sept jours; ils seront soumis aux mesures suivantes:

(a.) Les malades seront isolés à terre (dans le lazaret).

(b.) Tous les autres voyageurs descendront à terre, si cela est possible, et seront soumis au lazaret à l'observation médicale pendant 5 jours.

(c.) Il sera procédé à l'égard du linge et des habits sales des passagers, de l'équipage, &c., conformément au § 2 litt. a, b, c, d, et e.

4. Est interdite l'entrée en Bulgarie des effets suivants venant des pays contaminés.

(a.) Linge usé, vieux habits, et effets de literie usés, comme matelas, couvertures, &c.

(b.) Les haillons et les chiffons qui, ne provenant pas directement d'une fabrique, ne sont pas expédiés en ballots comprimés avec des cercles en fer et munis de la marque et du numéro des autorités sanitaires du lieu de provenance. En général, l'entrée en Bulgarie est permise à tous les effets neufs et usés, provenant directement d'une fabrique.

following translation of Italian Sanitary Ordinances:—

Ministry of the Interior

1895. Quarantina Regulations. No. 10.

In order to assimilate the measures in force against localities infested with cholera to the regulations published with regard to the administration of the Italian sanitary service, and, inasmuch as the danger of cholera being imported into Italy from the countries and districts mentioned immediately below is admitted to exist: viz., from European and Asiatic Turkey; the coasts of the Black Sea and the Sea of Azof; the Russian coasts of the Baltic Sea; and the Danube Ports of Russia and Roumania, Morocco, and Egypt; and in view of the above-mentioned Regulations respecting the sanitary service approved by Royal Decree, dated September 29, 1895,

The Ministry of the Interior decrees as follows:—

ART. 1. The regulations contained in Article 97, &c., of the above-mentioned law will be applied to vessels coming from the said places.

ART. 2. For vessels coming from these places and intending to obtain free pratique in Italian Ports, the medical visit and disinfection of dirty linen for personal or domestic use on board will take place in the first of such ports at which they touch.

At the other ports the medical visit and disinfection will be limited to persons and dirty linen for personal or domestic use which have been disembarked.

ART. 3. Mail steamers, which although touching at Italian ports proceed to foreign ports, can land passengers and goods in accordance with the regulations of Art. 91 of the above-mentioned law without it being necessary for them to obtain a special authorization from the Prefect of the Province in order to do so.

ART. 4. The following Sanitary Decrees are revoked:—

ART. 97. All ships will be subjected to a rigorous medical inspection of their passengers, and all their personal and domestic effects to disinfection, which are not found to be perfectly clean.

The doctors entrusted with visiting the ship, will decide in individual cases if the clothes of the passengers and crew must also be subjected to disinfection.

ART. 98. Ships on which cases of cholera have been verified during the voyage, or which, on their arrival, have cases or suspected cases of this illness on board, will be sent to the nearest quarantine station of Asinara, Poveglia, or Augusta, to undergo inspection and disinfection which, according to the previous Article and those other sanitary measures, shall have been determined upon from time to time by the Ministry of the Interior.

Ships falling into this condition during the voyage can steer direct for those quarantine stations before approaching any other Italian port, announcing the fact, if possible, by means of the semaphore.

ART. 99. These ships can be dispensed from proceeding to a quarantine station to undergo measures, in accordance with the preceding Article, when although cases of cholera have been verified on the journey, no other cases have occurred for at least five days on board after the complete cure or death of the sick person, and when they have a doctor on board and a stove for disinfection according to the Regulations.

The sanitary measures prescribed under these circumstances will be applied in the port itself at which the ship touches, or in the neighbouring sanitary stations. In no case, however, must the dirty water of the ship (*L'acqua della sentina*) be emptied into the harbour if it has not first been disinfected according to the Ministerial instructions.

ART. 91. Ships, which must submit to sanitary measures in accordance with the present Regulations or Ordinances in force, in order to be admitted to free pratique on account of their ports of departure, or of circumstances which have occurred during the voyage, will be able, without obtaining free pratique, to load and unload their goods, and even passengers, if they submit to all those measures of precaution which shall be considered necessary to avoid other contact with the shore.

In the case of the disembarkment of passengers, a special permission must be obtained from the Prefect, who will only grant it on the advice of the provincial doctor.

Passengers and cargo which are disembarked will be subject to the sanitary measures prescribed in their case.

ART. 92. The Minister of the Interior, in agreement with the Minister of Marine, will be able, under ordinary circumstances, to release ships from the obligation of presenting a bill of health on their arrival when they come from specified ports designated by special Ordinance.

1895. Sanitary Decree. No. 11.

In order to put in force again the Regulations respecting the importation of salt pork, smoked or otherwise preserved, and in view of the Law of December 22, 1888, and the regulations dealing with sanitary matters approved by the Royal Decree of September 29, 1895.

The Ministry of the Interior decrees as follows:—

ART. 1. The prohibition against the importation into Italy of pork, salted, smoked or otherwise preserved, remains in force for all countries in general with the exception of the following:—Austria Hungary, Germany, Switzerland, Denmark, United States of America.

ART. 2. The said flesh imported from the above-mentioned countries must be accompanied by a sanitary certificate of origin issued by the competent local authorities, and attested by the Italian Consul or Consular Agent residing or having jurisdiction in the place of export.

In view of the International Convention of Dresden, 1893, and in view of the Sanitary Regulations approved by Royal Decree of September 29, 1895.

Inasmuch as centres of infectious diseases (focolai epidemici) existed recently or still exist in European and Asiatic Turkey, the Island of Cyprus, countries beyond the Suez Canal, Russia, Germany, Austria Hungary, France and Algeria, Belgium, Spain, Egypt, Morocco, Brazil, Uruguay, and the Argentine Republic;

The Ministry of the Interior decrees:—

ART. 1. That the importation of old clothes and bedding, destined for sale into Italy from the States and countries above-named, shall be forbidden.

ART. 2. Permission will be given for the importation into Italy from the same States of (L).

Rags compressed by hydraulic force transported as goods in large quantities in bales fastened by bands of iron wire and bearing the mark or number of houses known to the authorities at the places of importation at exercising such commerce wholesale.

(b.) Of ends and shreds of new tissues coming direct from the spinner, dyer, tailor or washhouse (bleacher?).

Of artificial wools and bits of unused paper.

Also of old rags which have undergone the process of carbonization.

1895. Sanitary Decree. No. 13.

Whereas, in order to facilitate the task of the Authorities whose duty it is to carry out the Sanitary Decrees, it is desirable to re-enact, co-ordinate and complete the regulations respecting the importation into Italy by sea of animals and salted skins, of untanned hides, raw wool, horns, hoofs, bones, and other animal products.

In view of the Law of December 22, 1888, and of the Sanitary Regulations approved by the Royal Decree of September 29, 1895,

The Ministry of the Interior decrees as follows:—

ART. 1. The prohibition remains in force (a) against the importation of cattle and sheep from the following countries and districts:—

European and Asiatic Turkey, the Island of Cyprus, Egypt, Bombay, Russian Ports on the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, Bulgaria, Greece, Somaliland, Zanzibar.

(b.) Against the importation of cattle from the Island of Malta.

The importation of sheep from this Island is permitted on the condition that they are submitted to a veterinary visit on arrival at the expense of the person interested.

(c.) Against the importation of swine from European and Asiatic Turkey, the Island of Cyprus, Egypt, and the United States of America.

ART. 2. The importation of salted skins into Italy is prohibited from all those countries from which the importation of cattle and sheep is prohibited, with the exception of the Island of Malta.

ART. 3. The prohibition against the importation of untanned hides, raw wool, bones, horns, hoofs, &c., and other remains of cattle and sheep into Italy remains in force against Asiatic Turkey, Somaliland, and Zanzibar.

ART. 4. The importation into Italy of animals and animal remnants will be permitted from all other States on condition that both animals and animal remnants shall be accompanied a sanitary certificate of origin to be issued by the competent local authorities and attested by the Italian Consul or Consular Agent having jurisdiction in the locality from which the said animals or products are in the first place despatched.

ART. 5. Salted entrails and washed or calcined wool may be freely imported into Italy from any place whatever.
