## ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACTS, 1870-1893.

THE Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have issued an order this day for the compulsory formation of a School Board in the undermentioned Parish:—

THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Samuel Henry Phillips, of Mapleton, in the parish of Westerham, in the county of Kent, and of Grosvenor-street, in the county of London, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace for the said county of Kent, and one of the Commissioners for executing the Lieutenancy in and for the city of London, and to George Faudel Phillips, of Balls Park, in the county of Hertford, and of Grosvenor-gardens, in the said county of London, Esquire, Alderman of the Ward of Farringdon Within, in the Commission of the Peace for the said county of Hertford and for the county of Middlesex, and one of the Commissioners for executing the Lieutenancy in and for the said city of London, Her Royal licence and authority that they respectively may take and use the surname of Faudel in addition to and before that of Phillips, and bear the arms of Faudel quarterly with those of Phillips, and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by their respective issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of

arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.
