THE Queen has been pleased to approve of Dr. Julius Wilhelm von Waldthausen as Consul-General of Germany for British India and Ceylon, to reside at Calcutta; of Mr. Max Biermann as Consul of Germany at Bombay; of Don Michael de Cordoba as Consul of Honduras at Kingston (Jamaica); and of Don Joaquin de Pereyra y Ferrán, and Don Vicente Palmaroli y Reboulet, as Vice-Consul of Spain at London and Cardiff, respectively.

BY virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess:"

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, that George Godolphin Osborne (commonly called the Marquis of Carmarthen), late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Borough of Lambeth, Brixton Division, is become a Peer of the United Kingdom, and that a writ of Summons hath been issued to him under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to summon him to Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said Borough, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor having heard the opinion of the Board of Health has been pleased to modify Government Notice, No. 230 of 17th December, 1895, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :—

1. Vessels to stop outside the Harbour with permission for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter
