IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of West Suffolk, I hereby make the following Orders:—

1. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of West Suffolk:—

Bittern, Teal, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Red Necked Grebe, Sclavonian Grebe, Eared Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Kingfisher, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Nighthawk, Fern Owl), Golden Oriole, Barn Owl, Tawny Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Stone Curlew, Thicknee, or Norfolk Plover, Redshank, Common Snipe, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Great Bustard, Reed Bunting, Gadwall, Crossbill, Spotted Flycatcher, Marsh Harrier, Hen Harrier, Montague's Harrier, Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Hobby, Hawfinch, Heron, Landrail, Redpoll, Common Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Redstart, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Creeper, Turtle Dove, Bearded Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Coal Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Water Rail, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

2. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of West Suffolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those birds were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Great Bustard, Reed Bunting, Gadwall (Wild Duck), Crossbill, Spotted Flycatcher, Marsh Harrier, Hen Harrier, Montague's Harrier, Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Hobby, Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Landrail, Redpoll (Linnets), Common Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Redstart, Robin, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Creeper, Turtle Dove, Bearded Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Coal Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Water Rail, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).
