

Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester acting as such bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the aforesaid benefices (in testimony whereof the said Randall Thomas, Bishop of Winchester, has signed this scheme and sealed it with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said William Durst as the rector or incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary Southampton (in testimony whereof he the said William Durst has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same the following arrangements shall be made that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette all those sepa-

rate sums of stock or cash which are respectively specified in Columns II, III, and IV of the schedule to this scheme appended and which at present form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Mary Southampton shall be transferred from the said benefice of Saint Mary Southampton to the respective benefices mentioned in Column I of the same schedule and set opposite to the sums of stock or cash so to be transferred and shall as from the day aforesaid be annexed to the same benefices and form part of the endowments thereof.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
