**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 17TH MARCH 1896.)

**SHROPSHIRE PROHIBITED DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such

revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

3. This Order may be cited as the SHROPSHIRE PROHIBITED DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.
