

such period and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon.

9. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary, or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the licence, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

10. To empower the Council to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the licence, and to charge the moneys so borrowed and interest upon the district fund and general district rate of the district, and to empower the Council to apply any of their funds to any of the purposes of the licence, and to provide for the disposal or application of the revenue arising from the Undertaking.

11. To incorporate with the licence section 265 of the Public Health Act, 1875 (relating to the protection of local authorities and their officers from personal liability) and to extend that section to matters arising under the licence.

The names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—

Sea View-road, Liscard Village, Manor-road, Sea Bank-road, Rowson-street, Victoria-road, New Brighton, King-street, Brighton-street, Church-road, and Tobin-street.

The following are the streets not repairable by the local authority and tramways which the Council propose to take power to break up, that is to say:—Sea View-road, Liscard, Claremont-road, Wallasey, and the tramways of the Wirral Tramway Company Limited
