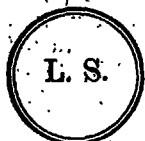

Erection of temporary Surveying Beacons.

THE Swedish Government has given notice that during the year 1896, surveying operations will be carried out between Gåsholmshällan (lat. 61° 01' N., long. 17° 17' E.) and Agö (latitude 61° 32' N., longitude 17° 28' E.); also between Brändöskär (lat. 65° 32' N., long. 22° 48' E.) and Rönnskär (lat. 65° 24' N., long. 21° 33' E.)
