#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 29TH APRIL 1896.)

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA INFECTED PLACE.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the farm buildings and yards at Canewdon Hall, in the parish of Canewdon, in the county of Essex, in the occupation of Harry Partridge,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be
