Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship County Antrim.

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship County Antrim, registered at the port of Belfast, official number 93179, and now owned by the County Steam Ship Company Limited, and such conveyance of animals by that vessel is hereby prohibited accordingly.

Offences.

2. If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—
