ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19th JUNE 1896.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREAS.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in that Schedule, is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

THE Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. Arthur William Wolfe-Smyth to superintend the transfer of Lascars, or other persons, at Belfast, in place of Mr. J. B. White, who has retired from the service, and to grant the Certificate required under Section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every Lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such Certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

No. 311.—ATLANTIC OCEAN—AZORES.  
*Horta Bay—Additional Light on Breakwater.*

THE Portuguese Government has given notice, dated 22nd May, 1896, that a red light is exhibited from the crane used in constructing upper portion of the breakwater in Horta Bay, Fayal Island.

This light will eventually replace the light-buoy, showing a red light, at present marking the extremity of the breakwater works.
