The Queen was afterwards conducted privately through the upper part of the Marble Hall and the Lower Rooms, and was received in the Vestibule of the Chapel by The Lord Chamberlain, The Lord Steward, and The Mistress of the Robes, who conducted Her Majesty to the Chair prepared for Her use in the Chapel in the following order, a March ("Marche Moliere") being played on the Organ:—
