WHEREAS by section twenty (3) of "The Finance Act, 1894," it is enacted that Her Majesty the Queen may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British possession where Her Majesty is satisfied that by the law of such possession either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that section;

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the law of the Colony of Western Australia as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (I) of the aforesaid section.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered that the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the Colony of Western Australia.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth

years of Your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Margaret Oxford situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford in the county of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford, and of the district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and of such district parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford, and of the district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town aforesaid should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Margaret, Oxford, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford as such Bishop, and with the consent of the President and Scholars of Saint John Baptist College in the University of Oxford as the patrons both of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford and of the vicarage of the said district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford, and of the said district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated

and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Margaret Oxford situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret Oxford.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Oxford comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometimes consolidated chapelry) of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford in the county of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford which is bounded upon the north by the district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the west upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town from the new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford aforesaid at the centre of the bridge No. 239 which carries Heyfield-road over the Oxford Canal and extending thence southward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to a point distant eighteen and a half chains or thereabouts to the north of the bridge which carries Walton Well-road over the said canal which point is opposite to the western end of the wall or fence which divides the house numbered 9, Southmoor-road from the house numbered 7 Southmoor-road both situate upon the western side of that road and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Southmoor-road aforesaid near to the point where such road bends towards the east and extending thence first eastward to and then north-eastward and eastward along the middle of the same road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Kingston-road and with Farndon-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodstock-road and extending thence eastward and in a direct line across the last-named road to the western end of the wall which divides the house numbered 76 Woodstock-road from the house numbered 78 Woodstock-road both situate on the eastern side of the said Woodstock-road and extending thence eastward along the said wall for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its eastern end and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the grounds attached to the house called or known as the Mount) to a point in the middle of Banbury-road opposite to Kelston Lodge and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford from the district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town which is bounded upon the west and upon the south by the above-described portion of the new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James

Oxford and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the east and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Banbury-road aforesaid distant eleven and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to the north of its junction with Saint Margaret's-road at which point the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford from the district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town aforesaid leaves the Banbury-road aforesaid in a westerly direction, and extending thence northward along the middle of Banbury-road aforesaid for a distance of twelve and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Staverton-road and continuing thence still northward along the middle of the said Banbury-road for a further distance of precisely two chains, and extending thence westward and south-westward in a line parallel to and distant precisely two chains to the north of the middle of the said Staverton-road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to a point a little to the north of the junction of the said Woodstock-road with Frenchay-road upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of (Saint John the Baptist) Summer Town from the new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James Oxford aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, and of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine, of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen, and of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer for the period hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (which said church and cure are hereinafter called 'the said

living') of the parish of Saint James Dover in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas by an Order of the Chancery Division dated the twenty-ninth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five and made by Mr. Justice Chitty 'In the matter of the estate of William Henry Robien Bettesworth deceased between Henry Paulson Bowling Trevanion plaintiff and Her Majesty's Attorney General defendant' a scheme was ordered to be adopted and carried into effect and it appearing by a certain consent therein mentioned that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners were willing to receive and hold the funds by the Payment Schedule thereto directed to be transferred to us upon trust in accordance with the said scheme, it was ordered that the funds in Court be dealt with as directed by the Payment Schedule thereto by which Schedule it was directed that upon the making of an Order in Council approving and ratifying a scheme of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purposes mentioned in the scheme approved by the said Order of the Chancery Division being certified certain funds in Court and interest should be transferred to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust pursuant to the said scheme by the said Order ordered to be adopted and carried into effect without prejudice to any question how the income of the said funds ought to be applied in case there should hereafter be a severance or division of the parish of Saint James Dover when any person claiming to be interested in such income is to be at liberty to apply but notice of any such application is to be given to Your Majesty's Attorney General.

"And whereas the said scheme by the said Order ordered to be adopted was in the words and to the effect following, that is to say 'Scheme for the application of the charitable legacy of six thousand pounds bequeathed by the will of the above named testator William Henry Robien Bettesworth as a permanent endowment for or by way of increase of the stipend of the minister for the time being of the parish church of Saint James Dover in the county of Kent (1) So soon as the patronage of the living of Saint James Dover as at present constituted shall by a scheme of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England approved and ratified by an Order of Her Majesty in Council have been vested in three trustees or the survivors or survivor of them (one to be the Archbishop of Canterbury or his nominee one to be the Plaintiff or his nominee and the third to be the Reverend Colin Grant Dalton Vicar of Wincanton Somersetshire or his nominee) for such period not exceeding thirty years from the date of the Order approving this scheme as shall be necessary to carry out the following trust that is to say upon trust that when a vacancy shall happen in such living during such period not exceeding thirty years the said trustees or the majority of them shall present or appoint to succeed to the said living the said Colin Grant Dalton (he being as appears by the Chief Clerk's Certificate of the fifth December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three the son of Alice Charlotte Grant Dalton a grandniece of the testator and then and now Vicar of Wincanton in the county of Somerset and the only person who on the twenty-fifth July one thousand eight hundred and ninety was entitled to the benefit of the condition as to patronage made by the testator): Provided that he the said Colin Grant Dalton shall be willing to accept such presentation or appointment and be eligible for institution and induction or collation to

the said benefice of Saint James Dover and upon trust that at the end of such period the patronage shall be re-vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury alone free from all the aforesaid trusts.

"(2) And so soon as the funds by the Order approving this scheme directed to be transferred to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall have been so transferred the income of the said funds from the date of such transfer as aforesaid shall until further order be paid to the rector or incumbent for the time being of the parish church of Saint James Dover by way of increase of his stipend."

"And whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said living of Saint James Dover is absolutely vested in the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Father in God Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in right of his See.

"And whereas the said Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury is desirous that the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said living of Saint James Dover should be transferred to and vested in such three trustees as aforesaid or the survivors or survivor of them for the period and purposes hereinafter specified.

"And whereas the said Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury Henry Paulson Bowling Trevanion and Colin Grant Dalton are willing to accept the said proposed transfer upon trust as aforesaid and in token of such their willingness have executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts hereinbefore recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas under the circumstances aforesaid it appears to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that the transfer of the patronage of the said living of Saint James Dover which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the said right of patronage and advowson arises and exists.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward White Archbishop of Canterbury as well as such patron as aforesaid as also as Bishop of the diocese of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) and with the consent of the said Edward White Archbishop of Canterbury Henry Paulson Bowling Trevanion and Colin Grant Dalton as intended transferees (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme).

"We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said living of Saint James Dover now vested in the said Archbishop of Canterbury as aforesaid shall for and during the period of thirty years from the twenty-ninth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five (determinable either upon the death of the said Colin Grant Dalton or the expiration of

three calendar months after the said Colin Grant Dalton shall have been presented or appointed to succeed to the said living under the trust in that behalf hereinafter expressed) be transferred from the said Archbishop of Canterbury and his successors to the said Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Henry Paulson Bowling Trevanion and Colin Grant Dalton (hereinafter referred to as 'the said Trustees') or the survivors or survivor of them and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be for and during the said period determinable as aforesaid vested in the said trustees or the survivors or survivor of them upon the trusts following that is to say:— (First) Upon trust that when a vacancy shall happen in the said living of Saint James Dover during the period aforesaid the said trustees or a majority of them or the survivors or survivor of them shall present or appoint to succeed to the said living the said Colin Grant Dalton if he the said Colin Grant Dalton shall be willing to accept such presentation or appointment and be eligible for institution and induction or collation to the said living. (Secondly) Upon trust at the end or sooner determination as aforesaid of the said period to reassume the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage and presentation so as to revest the same in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and his successors free from the aforesaid trusts and (Thirdly) in case when a vacancy shall happen in the said living during the said period the said Colin Grant Dalton shall decline to accept such presentation or appointment as aforesaid or shall be duly pronounced not to be eligible for such institution and induction or collation. In trust to present or appoint to succeed to the said living such person as may be nominated in such behalf by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being. And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Order of the Chancery Division or of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury. *C. or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:—

In the Parish Churchyard of North Scarle, in the county of Lincoln, until the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Horsham St. Faith, in the county of Norfolk, until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Harwell, in the county of Berks, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of Lambley, in the county of Nottingham, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six. *C. L. Peel.*

**FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS,
1878 to 1895.**

WHEREAS by Section 8 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that:—

“Where the Secretary of State certifies that in his opinion any machinery or process or particular description of manual labour used in a factory or workshop (other than a domestic workshop) is dangerous or injurious to health, or dangerous to life or limb, either generally or in the case of women, children, or any other class of persons, or that the provision for the admission of fresh air is not sufficient, or that the quantity of dust generated or inhaled in any factory or workshop is dangerous or injurious to health, the Chief Inspector may serve on the occupier of the factory or workshop a notice in writing, either proposing such special rules or requiring the adoption of such special measures as appear to the Chief Inspector to be reasonably practicable and to meet the necessities of the case.”

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion the process of sorting wool, goat-hair, or camel-hair, and the processes incidental thereto, are dangerous or injurious to health.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 4TH AUGUST 1896.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Slaughter of Dog suspected of Rabies, and Compensation.

1. The Local Authority of the county of Buckingham shall cause to be slaughtered within fourteen days after the date of this Order a St. Bernard dog belonging to John Lewis Phipps, of Oakley Court, Bray, Windsor, which dog is now in the district of the said Local Authority and is a suspected animal within the meaning of Article 14 of the Rabies Order of 1895, and the said Local Authority shall pay as compensation for such dog the value of the dog immediately before it was slaughtered.

Application of Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895.

2. All the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895 shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to the case of the dog slaughtered under

the provisions of this Order, and terms in this Order have the same meaning as in that Order.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in that Schedule, is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described

in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 7TH AUGUST 1896.)

BERKSHIRE BOROUGHES (MUZZLING OF DOGS) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1896.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the Districts of the Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by each of such Local Authorities within their District.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; and shall continue to operate and apply to each of the Districts mentioned in the Schedule to this Order until this Order is declared by further Order of the Board to cease to apply to such District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

3.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is muzzled with a cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a.) Packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) Dogs while being taken to or from Exhibitions, Shows, or other places if such dogs

are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895.

4. Subject to the last foregoing Article of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the Districts to which this Order applies.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i.) If the dog is diseased it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog is suspected it shall be detained and kept or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient.

(iii.) If the dog is not diseased or suspected, it shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention.

(iv.) If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

Offences.

6. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order—

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1895.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the BERKSHIRE BOROUGH (MUZZLING OF DOGS) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1896.
