**THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.
 NANTWICH CATTLE FAIRS.**

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Nantwich Urban District Council, as owners, that Fairs have been hitherto held in the town of Nantwich, in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th

December in each year; and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs hitherto held in the town of Nantwich, in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th December in each year, be held on the first Thursday in April, the first Thursday in June, the first Thursday in September, and the first Thursday in December in each case.

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873."

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fairs should be altered as proposed.

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act 1873," do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fairs which have been hitherto held in the town of Nantwich in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th December in each year, and that the said Fairs shall in future be held instead on the first Thursday in the months of April, June, September, and December respectively.

This Order shall not come into operation until the 1st day of January, 1897.

1. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Brecon, viz. :—

Hobby, Shrikes, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Red Start, Wheatear, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Nightingale, Blackcap, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Tree Pipit, Wryneck, Sand Martin, Swift, Nightjar, Turtle dove, Quail, Dotterel, Sandpiper or Summersnipe, all Owls, Wood Lark, Landrail or Cornerake, Water Rail, all Woodpeckers, Nuthatch, Kite, Buzzard

Kestrel, Waterouzel, Creeper, Stonechat, Gold Crest, Whinchat, Longtailed Tit, Bearded Tit, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Goldfinch, Curlew, Kingfisher, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Wild Duck.

2. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the Administrative County of Brecon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Hobby, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Red Start, Wheatear, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Nightingale, Blackcap, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Tree Pipit, Hoopoe, Roller, Barn Swallow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Swift, Turtledove, Quail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Rock Lark, Richard's Lark, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Landrail, Water Rail, Robin, Wren, Gold Crest, Longtailed Tit, Bearded Tit.

FORESHORE AT SWANAGE.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the port of Weymouth to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore between the north bank of the Ulwell Stream at Swanage and a point on the shore 270 yards north of the mouth of the said stream, being within the said port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore at Swanage between the points above-mentioned.

No. 567.—ENGLAND—WEST COAST.

River Dee Approaches—Alteration in Buoyage.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 407 of 1896:—

The Trinity House, London, has given notice, dated 22nd September, 1896, that the undermentioned buoys now mark the River Dee Approach.

c. West Rhyl Buoy, conical, red, lies in 15 feet at low water, with Rhyl Pier-head bearing S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., distant $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles, Carn of Cefn Yr Ogor Mountain in line with Gwrych Tower S.W., or approximately in lat. $53^{\circ} 22' 5''$ N., long. $3^{\circ} 33' 35''$ W.

h. North-west Patch Buoy has been altered to a can buoy, with red and white chequers, and surmounted by a staff and cylindrical cage. Approximate position, lat. $53^{\circ} 22' 25''$ N., long. $3^{\circ} 32' 45''$ W.

i. West Hoyle Buoy has been altered to a conical buoy, black, and surmounted by a staff and globe. Approximate position, latitude $53^{\circ} 25' 15''$ N., longitude $3^{\circ} 28' 30''$ W.

CAUTION.—Numerous alterations have recently taken place in the channels and the buoyage of the estuary of the River Dee, but as noted on the Chart, the buoyage is frequently altered and navigation is unsafe without a pilot.

If the siren is out of order, a prolonged peal and short peal on a bell is given in the same order as the blasts from the siren.

2. *Alteration of Fog Signals in Wandelaar Light-vessel.*

Wandelaar Fog Signal is made by a siren giving two successive short blasts every two minutes and a blast of two seconds' duration midway between each group of two successive short blasts, thus: two successive short blasts; silence about fifty-five seconds; one blast of two seconds' duration; silence of about fifty-eight seconds.

If the siren is disabled, peals of a bell, long and short, are made in the same order as the blasts of the siren.

Approximate position, lat. $51^{\circ} 22' 5''$ N., long. $3^{\circ} 1' 45''$ E.

3. *Alteration of Fog Signal at Wielingen Light-vessel.*

Wielingen Fog Signal is made by a siren giving three successive short blasts every two minutes, and a blast of two seconds' duration midway between the groups of three successive short blasts, thus: three successive short blasts; silence of about fifty-five seconds; a blast of two seconds' duration; silence about fifty-eight seconds.

If the siren is disabled, peals of a bell, long and short, are given in the same order as the blasts of the siren.

Approximate position, lat. $51^{\circ} 23' 20''$ N., long. $3^{\circ} 14' 20''$ E.

Intended Light in Adelaide River.

The lighthouse is an iron cylinder, 14 feet in height.

3. Borgmastargrund, on the north extreme of Arholmen, is alternating red and white, elevated 11 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 8 miles seaward, between the bearings S. 55° E. and S. 80° E.

The lighthouse is cylindrical, 8 feet in height.

4. Khalon Light is alternating red and white, elevated 40 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 11 miles, between the bearings S. 65° E. and S. 66° E.

Alteration in Character of Moella Island Light.

INFORMATION has been received from the Brazilian Government that Moella Island Light has been altered in character:—

Moella Island Light is flashing, showing alternately red and white flashes every thirty seconds, elevated 339 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 24 miles.

The lighthouse is of masonry, 31 feet high, with a house adjoining, painted white.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric of the 1st order.
