THE FAIRS ACT, 1873. NANTWICH CATTLE FAIRS.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Nantwich Urban District Council, as owners, that Fairs have been hitherto held in the town of Nantwich, in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th

December in each year; and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs hitherto held in the town of Nantwich, in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th December in each year, be held on the first Thursday in April, the first Thursday in June, the first Thursday in September, and the first Thursday in December in each case.

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873."

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fairs should be altered as proposed.

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act 1873," do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fairs which have been hitherto held in the town of Nantwich in the county of Chester, on the 26th March, the second Tuesday in June, the 4th September, and the 4th December in each year, and that the said Fairs shall in future be held instead on the first Thursday in the months of April, June, September, and December respectively.

This Order shall not come into operation until the 1st day of January, 1897.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Brecon, I hereby make the following Orders:—

1. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited thoughout the County of Brecon, viz.:—

Hobby, Shrikes, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Red Start, Wheatear, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Nightingale, Blackcap, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Tree Pipit, Wryneck, Sand Martin, Swift, Nightjar, Turtledove, Quail, Dotterel, Sandpiper or Summersnipe, all Owls, Wood Lark, Landrail or Corncrake, Water Rail, all Woodpeckers, Nuthatch, Kite, Buzzard
