WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine provision has been made for the surrender by the Government of the Straits Settlements to Foreign States in the case of which "The Extradition Act, 1870," does not apply, of persons accused or convicted of the commission of certain crimes and offences within the jurisdiction of such States.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twelfth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four the said Order of the nineteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine was amended.

And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Order of the nineteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council of the nineteenth

day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and this Order shall be read and construed as one Order.

2. The said Order in Council of the nineteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine may be cited as "The Straits Settlements Extradition Order, 1889," and this Order may be cited as "The Straits Settlements Extradition Order, 1896."

3. "The Straits Settlements Extradition Order, 1889," shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if the Territory of the British North Borneo Company had been specified in the second Schedule thereto, and the said Territory shall be deemed to be a "Protected State" for the purposes of the said Order.

4. In Clause thirteen of "The Straits Settlements Extradition Order, 1889," the expression "Minister of State" shall in the case of any of the Protected States (except the Territory of the British North Borneo Company) include any officer appointed by Her Majesty or by the Governor as Resident-General, Resident or Secretary to the Government in such State and shall in the case of the Territory of the British North Borneo Company mean the Governor of the said Territory.

The said Order in Council of the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS by Treaty, Capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, Her Majesty the Queen has jurisdiction within the Ottoman Dominions:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Her Majesty may from time to time, when She thinks fit, appoint a competent person to act temporarily as Special Judge of the Supreme
