## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 3RD NOVEMBER 1896.)

ZETLAND (STRANGLES) ORDER OF 1896.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

1. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals and strangles of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called strangles) shall be a disease for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Sections nineteen and twenty (slaughter and compensation);

Section twenty-two (Orders);

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections, including such sections as provide for offences and procedure.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2. Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with strangles, or suspected of being so affected, shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected, or suspected, to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or to one of his Assistants, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

3. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of strangles, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of strangles, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties conferred and imposed on him as Inspector by or under the Act of 1894 and this Order.

Public Warning as to Existence of Strangles.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, give public warning by placards, advertisement, or otherwise, of the existence of strangles in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any

such placard.

Slaughter.

5. The Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered-

(i.) Any horse, ass, or mule affected with

strangles; or

(ii.) Any horse, ass, or mule being or having been in the same stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist, or being or having been in contact with a horse, ass, or mule affected

with strangles.

(iii.) Provided, that if the owner of the horse, ass, or mule gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the horse, ass, or mule being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to cause that horse, ass, or mule to be slaughtered except with the further special authority of the Board first obtained.

Compensation.

6. The Local Authority shall, except as hereinafter provided, pay out of the local rate as compensation for any horse, ass, or mule slaughtered under this Order, the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.

7. The Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules in the whole of their District or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of the whole of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or

mule affected with or suspected of strangles; but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of any provision of any Order of the Board for the time being in force; and a Regulation under paragraph (d) of this Article shall operate so long only as any horse, ass, or mule, which in the judgment of the Local Authority is affected with strangles, remains in the stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the Regulations of the Local Authority as to cleansing and disinfection have been complied with.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing -and Disinfection.

8.-(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by horses, asses, or mules affected with or suspected of strangles:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be

(c.) For providing that such places should be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Occupiers and Owners to give facilities . for cleansing &c.

9. Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the occupier or owner thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

General Provisions as to Regulations of Local. Authority.

10.-(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation

made by thèm under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Withholding of Compensation.
11.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation in respect of a horse, ass, or mule (c.) For prohibiting or regulating the move- slaughtered by their order under this Order where ment out of any stable, building, field, or the horse, ass, or mule was in their opinion slaughtered by their order under this Order where affected with strangles at the time of its being

brought into their District.

(2.) The Local Authority before determining, under sub-section seven of section twenty of the Act of 1894 or under this Article, to withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation or other payment in respect of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered by their order under this Order, shall give to the owner of the horse, ass, or mule an opportunity of making representations to them respecting the facts and circumstances of the case, and shall consider the same.

Record of Slaughter.

12. The Local Authority shall keep, in the form provided by the Board, a record relative to horses, asses, or mules slaughtered by their order under this Order, stating the particulars indicated in such form, with such variations as circumstances require.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses. 13.—(1.) Every person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where, under any Regulation of the Local Authority made under

Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

- 14.—(1.) If any horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of such horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying such horse, ass, or mule, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on any horse, ass, or mule as required by a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the own r and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where, under a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, a

Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894

Interpretation.

15. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"Fodder" means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules:

"Litter" means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules:

"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning and scope as in the Act of 1894.

#### Extent.

16. This Order extends to the county of Zetland only,

Commencement.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Short Title.

18. This Order may be cited as the ZETLAND (STRANGLES) ORDER OF 1896.

GÖTEBORG APPROACH:

(1.) Light on Wittarne.

THE Swedish Government has given notice, that on 17th October, 1896, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Stora Vitten, the southernmost of the Wittarne Rocks:

Stora Vitten (Wittarne) Light is a fourth order, dioptric, flashing light showing the following sectors:—white from S. 69° E. to S. 52° E.; red from S. 52° E. to S. 37° E.; and white (of small power) from about N.W. by N., through north, io N.É. by E.

It is elevated 33 feet above high water, 'visible from a distance of seven miles in clear weather, and shown from a granite tower, standing on a foundation of concrete.

Jade River-Alteration in No. 6 Buoy.
