

Registration of Births and Deaths.

NOTICE is hereby given that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Sir Brydges Powell Henniker, Bart., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of December next, in order that Runcorn and Warrington Registration Districts may be made co-extensive with the Poor Law Unions of the same names, as altered by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (Warrington) Act, 1896," and that Warrington Sub-District of Warrington Registration District may be made co-extensive with Warrington Municipal Borough as extended by the same Act:—(1) the portions of Latchford Civil Parish previously parts of Appleton-with-Hull, Latchford Without, and Walton Inferior Civil Parishes shall be transferred from Budworth Sub-District of Runcorn Registration District to Warrington Sub-District of Warrington Registration District; (2) that the portion of Warrington Civil Parish previously part of Poulton-with-Fernhead Civil Parish shall be transferred from Rixton Sub-District of Warrington Registration District to Warrington Sub-District of the same Registration District; (3) that the part of Latchford Civil Parish now constituting Latchford Sub-District of Warrington Registration District shall be added to Warrington Sub-District of the same Registration District; and (4) that the part of Winwick Civil Parish now situated in Warrington Sub-District of Warrington Registration District shall be transferred to Winwick Sub-District of the same
