

In Parliament.—Session 1897.

Kingston-upon-Hull Corporation.

(Extension of Borough; Application of Existing Acts, &c., to Extension; Alteration of Wards and Provisions as to Constitution, Number, &c., of Council, and Extension of Powers and Duties of Council; New Bridge over River Hull; Deviation; Application of Existing Acts to New Bridge; Bye-laws as to Bridges; Compulsory Purchase of Land for New Streets and other purposes; Stopping Up of Streets; Special Provisions with reference to the Acquisition of Lands and Compensation therefor; Exception of Section 92 of Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; Repeal of Exemptions from Rates of Properties Abutting on Streets or Places formerly Maintained, Repaired, Sewered, Cleansed, or Lighted by the Dock Company at Kingston-upon-Hull, and of Properties of the North Eastern Railway Company; Licensing and Control of Boats on River Humber; Regulation of Common Lodging-Houses; Provisions as to Buildings and Streets; Dangerous Buildings, Advertisements and Hoardings, and Sky Signs; Drains; Vesting Drypool Green in Corporation and Regulating Same, and other Open Spaces; Power to Provide Crematories; Infectious Diseases Prevention; Street Betting; Recreation Grounds; Borrowing Powers; Consolidation of Sinking Funds; Creation and Issue of Stock; Redemption of Stock; Exempting Stock from or Composition for Transfer Duty; Corporation to be Sole Rating Authority in Borough; Transfer of Overseers' Duties; Water Charges; Rebates on Rates; Enactments Relating to Water to be Uniform throughout Borough; Certifying Water Meters; Application of Water Profits and Water Reserve Fund, and Reduction of Amount thereof; Borough Auditors; Power to employ Police for Certain Duties; Poll of Owners and Ratepayers; Revocation of Hackney Carriage Licenses; Repeal of Certain Sections of Hull Extension and Improvement Act, 1882; Power to Corporation, Kingston-upon-Hull Gaslight Company, British Gaslight Company, Limited, and Sutton, Southcoates, and Drypool Gas Company to Enter into Agreements for Certain Purposes; Dissolution of Kingston-upon-Hull Gaslight Company; Tolls, Rates, &c.; Bye-laws; Prosecution of Offences, Penalties, Service of Notices and Procedure; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts; Consolidation of Water Acts; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of Kingston-upon-Hull (hereinafter respectively referred to as "the Corporation" and "the borough") for an Act (hereinafter referred to as "the intended Act") to effect all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the boundaries of the borough so as to comprise for all municipal and other purposes (except parliamentary elections) the existing borough and the portions of the district of the Cottingham Urban District Council within the parish of Cottingham, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprehended within the following areas (hereinafter referred to as "the added areas"), that is to say:—

(1) The area within the following boundaries, namely, commencing at the angle on the

existing borough boundary at the centre of the line of railway known as the North Eastern Railway, Hull and Scarborough Branch, south of the Walton-street crossing on the Spring Bank, and extending westward along the existing borough boundary south of the Spring Bank to the centre of the line of the North Eastern Railway marked on the published Ordnance maps of the parishes of Newington and Cottingham, in the East Riding of Yorkshire (scale  $\frac{1}{25000}$ ), as the Hesse Road and Cottingham Branch, and thence passing along the centre of such railway in a northerly direction until it meets the old borough boundary at a point called the Cottingham Junction, and thence in a southerly and easterly direction along the existing borough boundary until it meets the point first described.

(2) The area within the following boundaries, namely, commencing at a point on the existing borough boundary at the centre of the River Hull, opposite the eastern end of the Clough-road, and extending westward along the existing borough boundary on the north side of the Clough-road and the Cottingham-road to the north-western extremity of the borough, passing thence in a southerly direction along the existing borough boundary to the south side of the Cottingham-road, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of 21 yards, or thereabouts, along the south side of the Cottingham-road, thence in a northerly direction across the Cottingham-road and along the east side of a ditch for a distance of 390 yards, or thereabouts, from the north side of the Cottingham-road, thence in an easterly direction along a fence for a distance of 255 yards, or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction along a fence for a distance of 270 yards, or thereabouts, thence along the south side of the Inglemire-lane in an easterly direction for a distance of 25 yards, or thereabouts, to the centre of the Cottingham Drain, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of such drain to the north side of the Endike-lane, thence in an easterly direction along the north side of the Endike-lane to the Beverley-road at Cross Bridges, thence across the Beverley-road to the north side of a ditch running from Cross Bridges in an easterly direction to the River Hull, thence along the north side of the said ditch to the angle in the existing borough boundary in the centre of the River Hull opposite the eastern end of such ditch, and thence in a southerly and easterly direction along the existing borough boundary in the centre of the said River Hull to the point first described.

2. The added areas will be shown on a map of the present and proposed extended boundaries of the borough, which will be deposited for public inspection with the Town Clerk of the borough, at his office at the Town Hall, Hull, on or before the 30th day of November instant.

3. To extend and make applicable, with or without modification, to and throughout the added areas, all or some of the powers, rights, privileges, authorities, and duties of the Corporation, and to vest in the Corporation, for the benefit of the extended borough, all the property of the Corporation subject to the duties and liabilities affecting the same.

4. To extend the jurisdiction, powers, authori-
