Tarmouth , June 1:

N Wednelday Night last a great ship belonging to Newcafile, but laden from Norway, nan upon a land off M'interion; but the next morning getting off from thence, unfortunately ran ashore near that Town 3 where she shill like with little

shopes of gotting eff again. This afternoon the Successive let fail from this Road, neering to the Northwards, which way deveral light thips have lately palled for Sunderland and Memorafile.

- Briffot, Juse 6. The new Man of War which is building in this Port, may within a week be ready to launch, and another Man of War of confiderable force, is ordered to be speedily built ; for which the materials are providing.

This week attived here the Friends Advenuere from Marfeiles, the Olive from Rouen, and the Fidelisz with Linnen from St. Malo's ; feveral other thips being likewife come into the River. The st. Andrews finall Must of War of London-Deery is now here ready for employment.

Rome, May 26. On F. iday 1 ft in the Evening Buily Pincento Rospigliosi, General of the Popes Gallies, dopateed from hence for Palo, and the next morning embasked with all his Train on the Gallies, the great Guns both from the Fleer and Fortress faluring him, and about Noon fer fail with a fair wind for Messing, where he is to j yn with the Galleys of Maltha, and astetwards to pursue his Voysge, to find out the Venetian Fleet.

On Monday last His Holinels gave in Extraordinary Audience to the French Ambaffadour, upon occasion of the atrival of a Courrier the day before from His Most Chrillian Majesty, communicating to the Pope the happy News of the mutual Katifications of the Treaty of Peace with Spains and in the Afternoon had a Conference of a hours with Cardinal Rospigliofs; and it is did that in Complement to His Holine's, the King his Master hath confermed that the Pillar of Ignominy erected in the late Popes time in memory of the affront offered by the Confick fouldiers to the then Ambaffadour the Duke de Crequy, that be forewity demolified.

The souh inftant Signi x Pi: 500 Macenigo returned hither from Noples, and the next day went hence towards Vepice, being commanded home by the Senare, in Ordei (da is faid) to his Employment at Ambashadour from that Republick to His Majefty of Great Bri tain.

From Naples we are told that the Viceroy being, not Getisfied what falutes are to be given to the Popes Gallies, 'is believed the General will not enter into that Pores. That the Governour of Gaeta having falued bim as he pathed with only r2 M rta s, willow the Canhon which to bught to have given him, the General has fede his Complaints to the Popes Nuncio in Naples, who repreferring it is the Viceroy, the faid Governour is to be fent for home and intprisoned, and another perfon to be preferred to that Government in his place.

Penlee, June E. All our Correspondencies front the Levans speak high of the great preparations made by the Grand Segnior for the carrying on the War with as much vigor and resolution as ever 3 which oblines the Senate to be as diligent for the relief of the City of Candua, to enable it to defend it solf agains the Outomati Power to which end they have lately hired feveral Dutch thips which arrived here with Merchandifes to take inprovisions of Corns Bisles, Powder, Match, with foldiers and fome Cannon, and the believed they may in few dayes be in readinels to follow the other Convoy, fome dayes lince put to fea under the Command of the Proveditot Corners and Monfieur de 51. Andre Monthrun 1 which we find hathelready pair by the life of Corfu with a fair wind.

Our Letters from Candia advile us that the Turks with the finall Army they have yet in the Field , continue the Siege with much oblinacy, p ying their Cannon, and endeavouring by their Mines to evert the Fort of Panige and the Half Moon of Mocenige, and have made fome approaches towards the Port of St. Andrew, but find in all places for flour reliftance, that the Vifiet delpairing of fuccels, has been frequently upon the point of railing the Siege; and being impatient that formall a part of the fuccors deligned for him, are yet arrived for the recruits of his decayed Army, has often relolved to embark himfe'f for Confissionple, to encourage the foldiers to the fervice i from which he has been diverted onely by his fease, leaft his ablence might projudice him in the effect of the G. and Segnior, and halten the fate which frequently attends the unfuecelful.

That which much increases his defpair of the reduction of Gandis, is the great backwardges of the fossidiery for this Emploiment, befides an information of fome of his principal Basis's, much difguited of late with the proceedings of the Ottoman Court 5, which has obliged the Sultan to employ a confiderable part of the forces otherwife defigned for Gandia, to reduce them to Obedience 5 they having of late much endamm ged the Turkish Bordors.

On Monday last in the Asternoon, Monsegnior Stots the now Nuncio from His Holinels, made his publick Entry, having been thet at stats Spirite by a confiderable number of Senstors in their Public Robes, and attended to his Houle 5 from thence he was the next morning by the fame Senators conducted to the Colledge : where he profented his Gredential Letters-with an Elegant Oracion, and was afterwards in the fame flate re-conducted to his Lodgings.

Several Performs of Quality see lately arrived here from Savoy and Piedmont, partly out of a curiofity to view this Gity, but principally to complement the Marquifs Ville upon his late return from Candia.
