NOTICE is hereby given that, in virtue of the most-favoured-nation Article in the Treaty between Great Britain and Japan of the 26th of August, 1858, the benefits of Article 17 of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation of April 4, 1896, between Germany and Japan in regard to the protection of patents, trade marks, &c., will be extended to British subjects.

Article 17 of that Treaty is worded as follows:—

“The Nationals of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy in the territories of the other the same protection as natives in regard to patents, samples (including patterns), designs, trade and manufacture marks, firms and names, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.”

It has been further agreed between Her Majesty's Minister at Tokio and the Japanese Government that the provisions of the above Article shall be brought into simultaneous operation in both countries on January 4, 1897.
