SPECIAL REGULATIONS (supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Second Assistant to the Lecturer on Electricity at the Artillery College.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration

for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25, and Candidates must be of the. prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.
